





Why do I recommend Fairmount Park as a sailing venue? There are two reasons: first it is a very pleasant pond with shelter and a bathroom. Just as important sailing at a community park showcases what our hobby is all about. With all the people watching the regatta perhaps we can generate some interest in joining the club. After the race is finished, I'm inclined to ask if anyone

wants to try RC Sailing. I never know who our next new member might be if I don't ask. Who doesn't like watching sailboat skimming along in a beautiful setting.

*Team event is a 4-lap race and a great opportunity to share these races and provide 1 on 1 mentoring or provide someone the sailing experience that doesn't have that class boat. The race starts with skipper #1 at the helm. That skipper runs 1 lap and turns the controller to skipper #2 when the vessel crosses the starting gate. At the end of lap 2 as the vessel crosses the starting gate, the controller is passed back to skipper #1. At the end of lap 3 as the vessel crosses the starting gate, the controller is passed back to skipper #2 who finishes the race. This is a great opportunity for mentoring.

After a 10-minute break for sail trim adjustments or a quick coffee break the event is repeated for a total of 8 laps with two skippers.

**All Sail

All sail boats are welcome to enjoy the fun. All vessels will start at the same time and will have 1 lap. Footy's and DF65's will have a ½ lap start. All other vessels will start at the same time. Individual classes will be scored. The event will last as long at the participants wish.

These 2 events are an experiment to generate more interest is racing. If it doesn't work, it doesn't work.

Racing rules:

A, Small Pond Racing rules, applicable at Fairmount Park

- 1, No boat shall touch either mark at the starting line, violators must complete a 360 degree turn and re-enter the race thru the starting gate.
- 2, Boats may touch any racing mark on the course assuming they pass on the designated side.
- 3, Touching or bumping another boat causing a loss of position the offending boat must take an immediate 360 turn. In the event no loss of position no action is required.
- B, US sailing rules appendix E including Standard Submission 201-11 of Sailing.org rules are applicable at Muir Lake.

Scoring:

The Race Director (RD) is responsible for scoring the race. The RD can appoint any member or observer to record the finishing sequence.

In the event the RD has not been established the first skipper to finish should record the finishing sequence.

It would be most beneficial if all race results could be published. Race results can be sent to bdmau@msn.com with race results in the subject line. The purpose of this request is to establish the actual number of races and participants. Race results will be distributed to all club members. Hopefully this will generate some interest in joining in either the casual or competitive fleets. This data can also be used to recognize shippers that are improving as the season develops.

How many races are conducted is one season? There are 12 "formal" races scheduled. There are approximately 16 Sunday DF races and approximately 16 Thursday night Soling races. That's 44 opportunities to join in the fun. As Gary Player, golf extraordinaire, said "the more I work and practice the luckier I seem to get". If you want to gain confidence and increase your sailing enjoyment, come out and sail. You will not find a friendlier group of competitive sailors. If it seems overwhelming just come out and try it a couple of times.
